Job Title: Researcher and Data Analyst

The Environmental Integrity Project (EIP) is seeking a researcher and data analyst to advance Clean Water Act, Clean Air Act, and other environmental protections at the federal, state, and local levels. The researcher's duties will include review of pollution permits; review and analysis of air emissions, wastewater discharges, and groundwater pollution data; and production of issue-focused reports. Candidates with an environmental management, science, or public health background and a demonstrated commitment to environmental protection are strongly preferred.

EIP is a nonprofit organization established in March of 2002 by former EPA enforcement attorneys to advocate for more effective enforcement of environmental laws. The organization has three objectives: (1) to provide objective analyses of how the failure to enforce or implement environmental laws increases pollution and affects the public's health; (2) to hold federal and state agencies, as well as individual corporations, accountable for failing to enforce or comply with environmental laws; and (3) to help local communities obtain the protection of environmental laws. Qualifications: Candidates should have an undergraduate and/or graduate degree or equivalent experience, preferably with significant coursework in the natural sciences. The ideal candidate will have a science background and a demonstrated commitment to environmental protection and non-profit advocacy. Further qualifications include experience working with air emissions or water quality data; strong writing and analytical skills; attention to detail; and an ability to work independently and manage time between multiple projects. Applicants **must** be comfortable working with Microsoft Word, Access, PowerPoint, and Outlook, and must have advanced skills using Microsoft Excel. Experience working with EPA's Toxics Release Inventory, Clean Air Markets, and Environmental Compliance History Online databases is a plus.
